Dear Sir,

An order has this moment been served on me that you should bring the letters before the Master within four days, and Mr Carr in his usual ungentlemanly spirit threatens to apply for a Serjeant at arms in case the order be not obeyed. I am sorry not to be able to give you a longer notice of coming to Town but I think this was the time that you expected to be here, and perhaps it may not be very inconvenient to you to come up in the early part of the week, and we can then arrange what course to take as to leaving the whole or a part of the Letters.

Although I do not think that the next of kin have any right to the Letters yet it may not be worth while on behalf of M^{de} de Saar to incur the expense of contesting the point. When I have the pleasure to see you I will communicate the advice which I have from counsel on the subject.
