

**Accession number:** 1992-24/39f/bb

**Description:** Very large sheet of paper, no watermark. Elevation and two floor plans of an unidentified house – possibly the villa at Hampton or, more likely, Adelphi Terrace.

**Transcript:** The drawing has no note to indicate where this house is, but the front elevation has some resemblance to that of the villa at Hampton, as shown on the drawing below. However, the drawing shows a basement floor, with the front door approached up steps, so it is more likely to be the town house.

There are two floor plans, one for a floor including a bay window and one without. The first labels the room with the bay window 'Drawing Room' and then 'Picture Room' and 'Landing of Principal stairs'. Behind them, there are two bedrooms with back-to-back chimneys, both with doors through to a narrow corridor forming dressing rooms and cupboard. The other floor shows a similar chimney stack at the front and corridor of dressing/store room at the back and a landing for the back stairs; there are four bedrooms, two with dressing rooms. There is also a mysterious square area, not labeled, with no door or windows.

**Notes:** See 1992-24/39f/aa which is a smaller drawing of a partial floor plan. Although that, too, shows a room with a bay window, the adjoin rooms and stairs do not match with those shown on this document. Also, the papers on which they are drawn are not the same and the drawing styles are different.
