**James Clutterbuck:** A friend of DG. 'James Clutterbuck (?1704 – 76) had substantial business interests, and was in partnership with Gastrell, a mercer, who often supplied Drury lane with stage materials. He was also [Somerset] Draper's brother – in –law.

Garrick saw both men frequently at the Queen's Arms in St. Paul's Churchyard, where they formed a club — "my brethren at the Queen's Arms". I. McIntyre, *Garrick* (London: Allen Lane, 1999), 109n. Clutterbuck seems often to have advised DG on the business side of the theatre.
